## Standard Quiz Grades for Math 6:

4 - Mastery: You have totally mastered the skill. You have demonstrated a full understanding of the concepts involved, have clearly shown ALL steps of your reasoning, have used units and notation correctly, and have made NO math errors.

3 - Meets: You have a firm grasp of the skill, meaning you demonstrated an almost full understanding of the concepts involved, but you did not show some steps of your reasoning, didn't use notation correctly, and/or made an error.

2 - Developing: You have demonstrated some conceptual understanding of the skill. You possibly have some confused reasoning, did not completely answer the question, did not use correct notation, and/or made a critical error.

1 - Beginning: You have demonstrated a weak or no conceptual understanding. You possibly have confused reasoning, and/or made one or more critical errors.

Students may receive a $1.5,2.5$, or 3.5 if their work shows evidence of being between the levels listed. However, for report card purposes, any student with a best score ending in 0.5 will be reported as the value excluding the 0.5 . For example, a 2.5 will be reported as a 2 .

## In the Grade Book:

Students get three chances at each standard quiz. Their best score is reported in Synergy according to the following scale converting the number earned to a letter grade and percentage.
$4=100 \% \mathrm{~A}$
$3.5=90 \% \mathrm{~A}-$
$3=85 \%$ B
$2.5=75 \% \mathrm{C}+$
$2=70 \%$ C
$1.5=65 \%$ D+
$1=60 \% \mathrm{D}$
